當時的世界大事計有:

- 越南戰爭
- 美國水門事件
- 首次進行腎臟和胰臟移植手術
- 當時全球最高的摩天大廈-世貿中心-在紐約落成啓用
- 第一部用袖珍電池供電的計算機以美金 一百五十元的價格在市場出售
- 倫敦和紐約之間開始有長途電話直撥服
- 獲得奧斯卡獎項的演員是佐治史葛和格 蓮達積遜等老牌影星
- 當時的樂壇巨星是卡洛金(Carole King)和 賽門與葛芬柯雙人組合(Simon & Garfunkel)這些流行歌手

在過去三十年的歲月裡,我們見證了香港、中 國以至整個世界經歷重大的變遷。所謂時移勢易、

滄海桑田。蘇聯解體、東歐集體瓦解、歐盟不斷擴張、亞洲經濟持續發展、中國晉身成為先進強國, 而香港亦成為國際金融及商業中心,更在史無前例 的一國兩制構思下回歸祖國,享受高度的自治自 主。

與此同時,科技、醫藥等各個範疇的研究及發展工作均突飛猛進。我們亦進入了互聯網時代。以前看來是不可能的種種事情,現時都可夢想成真。

發展迅速 突破求變

今天我們坐在電腦前,只是彈指之間,便可跟 地球其他角落聯繫起來。科學技術的迅速進步,通 訊和資訊科技的驚人發展,不同社會之間越趨頻密 無間的思想交流,以及國際貿易的蓬勃發展,都拉 近了人與人之間的距離。請容許本人這樣說,我們 今天生活的世界其實就是一條「地球村」。

這些發展對社會各方面都帶來了急速和深遠的轉變。對於未來的世界,只有一點我們是可以肯定的,這就是轉變的步伐很可能會加快。面對既艱巨,且又令人振奮的挑戰,我們就要不斷地創新求變,而最重要的是,如果我們要爲這個「地球村」作出貢獻,或者說要在這個「地球村」生活下去,我們就要做一個「世界公民」。那麼,「世界公民」又應具備些甚麼條件呢?

第一,世界公民須具有國際視野。

從政治、經濟、社會以至科技發展的層面來 看,現今的世界,正因為種種全球性的問題而不斷 發展出新的面貌。故此,我們必須對這些全球性的 問題有透徹的瞭解。同時,世界公民要有精密的分 析力和敏銳的洞察力,又要時刻掌握時代脈搏,留 意新形勢,以面對這個瞬息萬變的時代。

競爭年代 務必進取

我們必須認識到,我們正處身於一個充滿競爭的年代,我們的競爭對手除了是日常周遭所遇到的人外,還有來自世界各地的人。在這種情況下,我們更需要才智兼備、靈活變通。對於處理各類極為棘手的問題,我們往往要透過國際社會的共同努

力,才可獲得解決問題的方案。國際層面的交流與 切磋不但有助我們解決問題,亦能同時開闢新的契 機。正因如此,我們應該認識世界各地不同的文化 習俗,並培養我們和其他有不同文化背景的人溝通 和一起工作的能力。

第二,世界公民應該以開明的思想和尋根究 底的精神去面對人生。

我們應時刻以追本溯源的精神,以不同的觀點 和角度考慮問題,提出新見解。此外,我們亦應具 備適應新事物的能力,打破局限,突破自我,不應 故步自封。我們應本著精益求精的原則,敢於挑戰 傳統,既要能靈活變通,又要能積極進取,勇於嘗 試,不斷求新。

第三,世界公民要不斷學習,提高自己的知 識水平和技能,以應時代所需。

對我們來說,終身學習對加強我們在國際社會上的競爭力,至爲重要。需知道學院教育旨在啓迪學員,所教授的祇是求取學問的門徑而非學問本身;學海無涯,世界公民必須秉持終身學習的信念,身體力行,不斷充實自己,提升個人技能,包括語文能力及資訊科技方面的知識。人生本是一個不斷學習的過程,我們必須好好掌握其中的學習機會。

勇於承擔 為眾謀福

第四,世界公民必須正直不阿,推己及人和 **勇於承擔**。

人類社會各方面的活動和運作,相互依存,息息相關。明白了這個重要的道理後,我們便應以遠大的目光去爲社會作出貢獻。我們不僅要追尋個人的幸福,而且還要爲社會大眾謀求福祉。我們必須要爲家庭、事業和社會其他人士作出重大的承擔。

同時,我們還須堅持奉行誠實正直這兩個恆久 的社會準則,時刻關心弱勢社群。我們也必須擁有 廣闊的胸懷,樂意與人分享成果,並要竭誠爲改善 人類的生活作出貢獻。

最後一點,世界公民必須以信念和勇氣去面 對挑戰,克服困難。

在一個競爭如此激烈的環境中生活和工作,總會有成敗得失。在人生的旅途中,有晴空萬里的日子,也有風高浪急的時候。有些時候,我們會一帆風順,但又有一些時候,我們會覺得舉步維艱。但,無論所處的環境如何,我們都必須奮勇向前,最重要的是懷著信念和勇氣,走向未來,憑著自己的實力和信心,克服逆境,面對挑戰。

今天在座各位畢業的同學,你們走完了人生中的一個里程,並將展開另一個新的階段。你們是世界公民,你們也必須作世界公民。作爲世界公民,你們會發現生命是充滿挑戰,令人振奮和非常有意義。本人藉此機會祝願你們展翅高飛,鵬程萬里。

The Hon. Chief Justice Li: Be a versatile performer in competitive world

Keynote Address by The Honourable Chief Justice Andrew Li at the 28th Graduation Ceremony

Dr Hu, Dr Chung, Distinguished Guests, Ladies and Gentlemen,

I am greatly honoured to be invited to speak on this happy occasion. And I am delighted to be here.

Shue Yan College is a well recognised institution of higher learning, both in Hong Kong and in the Region. Over the last three decades, the College has made an enormous contribution to higher education in Hong Kong. Through provision of quality education, it enhances the diversity and richness of the education opportunities for many young people in Hong Kong. As a self-supporting institution, the achievement of Shue Yan is remarkable and commendable.

I am sure you would agree with me that Shue Yan's success owes a great deal to the vision, the dynamic leadership and the dedication of Dr Hu and Dr Chung. Being the founders of the College, Dr Hu and Dr Chung have nurtured the College from infancy to maturity, leading it to meet difficult challenges and to progress from strength to strength. Their commitment to the highest ideals of education commands the respect of us all.

To all the students graduating today, I wish to offer my warmest and heartiest congratulations. With your dedication and hard work, you have deservedly earned your diplomas and awards. I am sure that all gradu-

ates will agree with me when I say that you owe a great deal of gratitude to your families and the teaching staff of the College. It is a debt of honour which I am sure you will never forget. Throughout the past few years, they must have given you their unstinting support and wise guidance. Without them, I doubt if you will be here today. They must be very happy today and have every reason to be proud of your achievement. To them, I also wish to extend my congratulations and best wishes.

Shue Yan College was founded in 1971, some 30 years ago. The world was a very different place then.

For Hong Kong:

* It was very much a colony with an expatriate dominated Executive and Judiciary and an appointed Legislature.

- * The ICAC, the Independent Commission Against Corruption, had not yet been established.
- * There was no Mass Transit Railway (MTR).
- * Hong Kong was an economy based on manufacturing.

As to China:

* It was still affected by the cultural revolution and its aftermath. And it was basically closed to the outside world.

Major events to shake the world around that time included:

- * The Vietnam War
- * The Watergate affair in the US
- * The world's first kidney and pancreatic tissue transplant
- * World Trade Center, the then tallest building in the world, opened in New York
- * The first battery-powered pocket calculator was marketed at a cost of US\$150
- * Telephone direct-dialing between London and New York was introduced
- * Stars like George Scott and Glenda Jackson were Oscar winners
- * Carole King and Simon & Garfunkel were pop stars of the day

The last 30 years have seen the most momentous changes in Hong Kong, China and the World. There have been sea changes in the geopolitical landscape. The Soviet and the Eastern Bloc has disintegrated. The European Union is developing. Asia has been and will continue to be an area of growth. A strong and modern China has emerged. And Hong Kong has become an international financial and commercial center and was re-unified with China under the imaginative concept of one country two systems, exercising a high degree of autonomy. At the same time, we have seen

massive and the most amazing advances in science, technology and medicine and in every field of human endeavour. And we have entered the age of the internet. Many things which seemed impossible in the past are possible nowadays.

Today, sitting at our computers, we are linked in a matter of moments to the rest of the globe. The rapid advances in science and technology, the amazing revolution in the field of information and communication technology, the increasingly free exchanges of ideas between societies and the dynamic growth in international trade have brought all of us closer together. We talk today - without poetic licence - of living in a 'global village'.

These developments have brought about rapid and profound changes in all spheres of society. Only one thing is certain about the future. The pace of change is likely to accelerate. In order to respond to the difficult and exciting challenges ahead, it is crucial that we continue to adapt ourselves. Above all, in order to be able to contribute to and indeed survive in the 'global village', we need to be 'global citizens'. But what does this involve?

First, global citizens should see things from a global perspective. They must have a good appreciation of global issues which are constantly shaping and changing the political, economic, social and technological landscape of the world. They should be alert, well informed, analytical and insightful, and know where they stand in the sea of continuing change. They must understand that they are living and working in a highly competitive environment. And in this environment, they would be competing not only with people they meet day in and day out, but also with their

counterparts around the world. They should be highly resourceful, knowing that cross-fertilization of ideas and global collaboration will always present opportunities and help to provide solutions to problems. And they should have an understanding of the diverse cultures around the world, and should be capable of communicating and working with people with different backgrounds from around the globe.

Secondly, global citizens should view life with an inquisitive and open mind. They should always ask 'why' and explore new answers and solutions to problems. They should accept and embrace change and they should not set limits to what can be achieved. They must never take things for granted, always striving to make improvements and prepared to challenge orthodoxy. They should be flexible and innovative, with the courage to try things out.

Thirdly, global citizens should constantly educate themselves so that they would have the knowledge and skills required from time to time. They should understand that the means of survival lie in the life-long pursuit of education in all respects. Things taught at schools and universities are not an education but only a means to an education and there are no limits and boundaries to learning. Global citizens must therefore believe in and practise learning for life. They must continue to acquire and upgrade all their skills including language proficiency and information technology. And they must be keen to continue to learn from experience in the university of life.

Fourthly, global citizens should act with integrity, generosity and commitment. Understanding the importance of interdependency in all spheres of human activity and endeavour, global citizens must look beyond their self-in-

terests in the pursuit of the well-being of the community at large. They must have a strong commitment to their families, their work and their fellow citizens. And they must abide always by the enduring values of honesty and integrity. They should always have the welfare of the under privileged in mind. They should be generous and ready to share with others. And they should be earnest in working towards the betterment of mankind.

Finally, global citizens should face and overcome difficulties with faith and courage. Living and working in such a competitive environment, global citizens would be bound to experience ups and downs in life. Sometime, the sun will shine on you. But at other times, life can be stormy. Sometimes, the sailing will be plain. At other times, the territory will be rugged. But there could be no turning back. It is important always to move on with faith and courage and tackle what life throws at you with confidence in your own ability to overcome adversity.

For students graduating today, you have concluded a stage in your life's journey and will be embarking on your next stage. You are and have to be global citizens and as global citizens, you will find life challenging, exciting and rewarding. I wish you good fortune and every success and happiness.

Welcome back, Ms Hope

Ms Andrea Hope, the academic consultant for the first round of Shue Yan's successful accreditation exercises in year 2000-2001, is back. This time, she has come to stay in the capacity of our Associate Academic Vice President, a fully fledged member of the Shue Yan family.

Ms Hope is no stranger to the college. She joined Shue Yan as an accreditation consultant in 2000 at the invitation of Dr Chung, Vice President of the College. Her duties at that time included helping to prepare all the documents necessary for the academic validation by the Hong Kong Council for Academic Accreditation (HKCAA), training staff members to cope with the frequent visits of and meetings with the validation panelists and communicating with officials and scholars of the validation committee.

With the concerted efforts of the college authority and staff, including the creative work of Ms Hope, three of our programmes, namely Accounting, Journalism and Communication, Chinese Language and Literature, passed the assessment and began to offer degree courses as of September 2001. On June 13, 2002, the Social Work Department was also approved to offer Bachelor's degree courses starting from September 2002.

Finishing her contract, Ms Hope went to Vancouver, Canada, where she worked for the Commonwealth of Learning, an intergovernmental organization engaged in advising and helping developing countries of the Commonwealth to improve and expand their education systems to meet the needs of their citizens.

In an interview with reporters of this journal, Ms Hope said that "My job duties at Shue Yan this time still focus on academic accreditation." She said the first programme to be validated will be the Bachelor of Business Administration (BBA). "If the validation exercise, which will take place on June 9-11, is successful, the BA Department will begin to offer degree courses in September 2003."

The next round of validation will involve the departments of Economics, Sociology, and Counseling and Psychology. The time schedule is still unknown. They may take place by the end of this year or at the beginning of 2004, according to Ms Hope.

Turning back to Shue Yan's current round of validation, Ms Hope said that she has had a tight schedule. There are only 10 weeks left before HKCAA's first academic visit. "To meet the deadline," she said, "I have had to work very hard in cooperation with the head of the BA Department, Dr Ricky Szeto, in drafting the documents to be submitted to the validation committee. And we have to organize mock meetings to train our staff for such visits."

Ms Hope did not think accreditation itself is stressful. "But it is a process that requires high energy and good team-building skills." As to the success rate of the accreditation, Ms Hope said it was still too early to predict. However, she said "We only go forward for academic accreditation if we are confident that we can succeed."

Ms Hope smiled when her name became a topic during the interview. She said that it is a common Scottish name, which she believes will bring her advantage in Chinese society. It may bring her advantage in the College too. "This time," she said, "I will have a long commitment. Although I take part in validation work most of the time, I do get involved in academic decision-making on a wider basis. I am now a member of the SYC management team rather than a helpful outsider."
